

**MINUTES**  
**Spartanburg County**  
**Legislative Delegation**  
**Tuesday, November 25, 2008**

A public meeting of the Spartanburg County Legislative Delegation was held on Tuesday, November 25, 2008 in County Council Chambers of the Spartanburg County Administrative Office Building. In compliance with applicable law, notices of this meeting were mailed in advance to all members of the Delegation, the local news media, and other interested parties at the addresses on file with the Delegation secretary.

A quorum was present, those in attendance representing a 56.4 share of the total voting power of the Delegation.

As the senior elected official resident within the county, Sen. Reese opened the meeting at 7:11 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and Sen. Martin delivered the Invocation. Sen. Reese made brief remarks explaining the necessity and purposes of the meeting. Sen. Peeler made brief remarks noting his agreement with the necessity of the meeting and urging all members of the Delegation to work toward solving larger problems facing Spartanburg County.

**1. ELECTION OF TEMPORARY CHAIRMAN**

Sen. Bright nominated Sen. Reese as temporary chairman and Rep. Millwood seconded the nomination. No other nominations were made and Sen. Reese was elected without opposition.

**2. ELECTION OF DELEGATION OFFICERS: CHAIRMAN**

Chmn. Reese called for the election of a permanent Delegation chairman.

Sen. Bright nominated Rep. Joey Millwood, Sen. Reese seconded. Sen. Peeler nominated Rep. Littlejohn, Sen. Martin seconded. No other nominations were offered. Nominations were closed.

Rep. Millwood received 41.6 share of the vote; Rep. Littlejohn received 14.80 share of the vote.

Sen. Martin was recognized for a point of personal privilege and explained that although he was a strong supporter of Rep. Littlejohn and had publicly promised to nominate him, that he could not in good conscience vote for Rep. Littlejohn since he had declined Sen. Martin's personal request to attend the meeting.

Since no nominee received a majority of the vote, Sen. Martin called for a second ballot.

On the second ballot, Rep. Millwood received 55.39 share of the vote and Rep. Littlejohn received 1.01 share of the vote: Rep. Millwood was elected.

Rep. Millwood assumed the chair.

### 3. ELECTION OF DELEGATION OFFICERS: VICE-CHAIRMAN

Chmn. Millwood called for the election of a vice-chairman.

Sen. Bright nominated Sen. Martin as vice-chairman, Sen. Reese seconded the nomination. No other nominations were offered. Nominations were closed.

Sen. Martin received 55.39 share of the vote and was elected vice-chairman without opposition.

### 4. APPOINTMENTS

Sen. Bright recommended that in the interest of avoiding any question or confusion as to the legality and propriety of appointments to the various boards and commissions of political subdivisions within Spartanburg County which were made at the previous Delegation meeting the Delegation should reconsider those appointments.

On motion of Sen. Bright the Delegation modified the agenda to specifically take up appointments made at the November 10, 2008 Delegation meeting. Motion was adopted without opposition.

On motion of Sen. Bright the Delegation ratified all appointments made at the November 10, 2008 Delegation meeting. Motion was adopted without opposition.


### 5. OLD BUSINESS
